If you have a few hours to spare on either of these days and would be willing to help it would be greatly appreciated. A reminder form has been sent home today. Please return ASAP.


End of term


Five tips to help you make the most of reading to your children

Reading to your child is one of the most successful ways of instilling a love of reading in them.

- 1. **Give it all your attention.** Make reading part of the daily routine. Reading is both an opportunity to model how the written words sounds and a chance for family bonding. Everyone should be comfortable, and children should associate time spent being read to with enjoyment.
- 2. **Engage with the story.** Sharing your response to a book and encouraging children's responses stimulates critical thinking. Take turns in reading as this is beneficial for a range of reading skills, such as comprehension, word recognition and vocabulary building.
- 3. **There's no age limit.** We should read to young people for as long as possible. There is no age where the benefits of being read to completely expire.
- 4. **Pick a book you both enjoy.** Reading together is a great opportunity to share your passions while broadening you children's horizons through diverse book choices. This can also help extend your child's vocabulary.
- 5. **Don't worry about your style.** Not all of us are destined to be award-winning voice actors, and that's OK. Use expression and adopt different voices for characters in a book to the level your feel comfortable doing.

Being taken into the virtual reality of story is a memorable, pleasurable experience that stays with us forever. Reading aloud provides with a valuable opportunity to slow down, relax and share the wonderful world of books.
