Non-Contact Infrared thermometer / Students Illness

All South Australian preschools and schools have been provided with a non-contact infrared thermometer. This has been provided by the Department for Education for us to use as an assessment when a child appears unwell at school.

Non contact infrared thermometers are used to measure a person's temperature rapidly with no body surface contact. They can provide temperature reading in seconds by measuring the temperature of the central forehead area.

SA Health confirms that a fever is 38 degree Celsius or more. The thermometer has a high temperature alarm set at more than 37.2 degrees Celsius. If your child appears to be unwell at school, it is likely that their temperature will be taken and you will be asked to collect them as soon as possible.

Please remember when your child is showing any symptoms of being unwell please keep them home. (Runny nose, sore throat, high temperatures, headaches, etc). When your child/ren are absent from school please notify the Front office by one of the following options:


